Reading Aloud (ASL or English)

- 15 Principles of Reading to Deaf Children
- 1. Translate stories using American Sign Language (if needed)
- 2. Keep both languages (ASL and English) visible.
- 3. Elaborate on the text.
- 4. Reread stories on a "story telling" to a "story reading" continuum.
- 5. Follow the child's lead.
- 6. Make what is implied explicit.
- 7. Adjust sign placement to fit the story.



(15 Principles for Reading to Deaf Children (Schleper, 1997))

Reading Aloud (ASL or English)

- 15 Principles of Reading to Deaf Children
- 8. Adjust the signing style to fit the story.
- 9. Connect concepts in the story to the real world.
- 10. Use attention maintenance strategies.
- 11. Use eye gaze to elicit participation.
- 12. Engage in role playing to extend concepts.
- 13. Use ASL variations to sign repetitive English phrases.
- 14. Provide a positive and reinforcing environment.
- 15. Expect the child to become literate.




Real World Literacy

- Authentic Reading is reading a variety of text for real purposes. Authentic reading is most like that which occurs in everyday life.
- Authentic Reading includes: reading that is meaningful, relevant, and useful to the reader; supporting readers with a print-rich environment; providing choice within a variety of forms and genres; having the opportunity to interact with others in response to the text; focusing on communicating ideas or shared understandings; providing authentic meaning-making experiences: for pleasure, to be informed, or to perform a task.


