## Uses

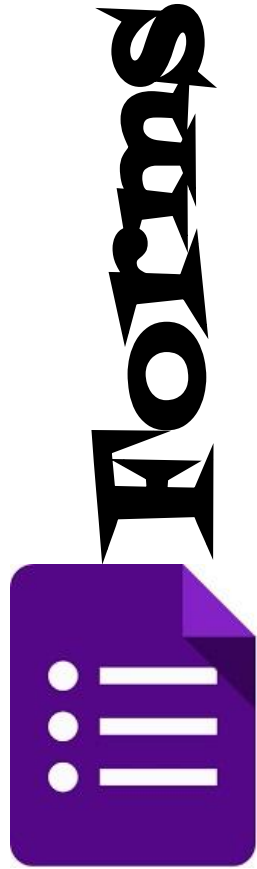
- Sharing lesson plans
- Sharing student accommodations and IEP data
- Monitoring student work
- Providing quick, meaningful feedback to students
- Providing templates to students who need them



# Slides

## Uses

- Class presentations/lessons
- Easy to use for students
- Allows for student collaboration
- Allows for teacher collaboration



## Uses

- Progress Monitoring
- Quizzes/Tests (Including re-takes!)
- Surveys
- Instant Data



# Classroom

## Uses

- Paperless classroom
- Students CAN'T LOSE ASSIGNMENTS!
- Visual cues for missing assignments
- Easy collaboration between co-teachers
- Allows for parent access
- Quick access to student work samples



## Uses

- Organize websites needed for research or lesson plans
- Keeps notes that you take with the website you took the notes from
- Greatly aids students who struggle with executive functioning

## Uses

- Provides leveled texts for all Common Core Standards
- Allows students and teachers to login via Google
- Includes a “Guided Reading” mode to ensure that students are reading all of the text
- Rigorous questions and engaging texts
